

PER 211 EMS Operations and Planning for WMD course for Community Colleges

In conjunction with a grant provided through the Department of Homeland Security, the Texas Engineering Extension Service can cooperatively offer your program an opportunity to schedule, at no charge, a delivery of the 24-hour PER 211 class. The typical programs our class can support as a capstone course are the following:

- Nursing
- Emergency Medical Services
- Fire Fighter

This comprehensive course provides participants with an opportunity to gain further working knowledge regarding response to a CBRNE event. Students will participate in a combination of interactive didactic sessions, as well as application of skills and knowledge on state of the art human patient simulator technology.

We believe the class serves as “value added” for your program participants and more importantly will enhance the personnel safety and understanding necessary to effect an efficient CBRNE response on the part of your graduates. The course is approved for continuing education credit by CECBEMS, Texas Department of State Health Services, American Academy of Family Practitioners, and the Emergency Nurses Association. Course content is designed to provide value to students completing their initial certification course as well as those seeking recertification hours towards maintenance of their existing certification/license.
